SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Expands ability of employer to prohibit use of medical marijuana in workplace.

2	Relating to drugs in the workplace; amending ORS 475.340.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 475.340 is amended to read:
5	475.340. Nothing in ORS 475.300 to 475.346 [shall be construed to require]:
6	(1) Requires a government medical assistance program or private health insurer to reimburse
7	a person for costs associated with the medical use of marijuana; [or]
8	(2) Requires an employer to:
9	(a) Accommodate the medical use of marijuana in any workplace[.] regardless of where the
10	use occurs;
11	(b) Allow an employee or independent contractor to possess, consume or be impaired by
12	the use of marijuana during working hours; or
13	(c) Allow any person who is impaired by the use of marijuana to remain in the workplace;

15	(3) Precludes or restricts an employer from establishing or enforcing a policy to achieve
16	or maintain a drug-free workforce.
