SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

[Establishes patient centered primary care home program in Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research to define core attributes of patient centered primary care home, to establish process to identify patient centered primary care homes that meet core attributes and to develop uniform quality measures and policies related to patient centered primary care homes. Requires Director of Human Services to appoint advisory committee.]

[Authorizes Department of Human Services to provide reimbursement for patient centered primary care home services in medical assistance program.] [Creates Statewide Health Improvement Program to develop goals for reduction of chronic disease

factors and implement strategy to achieve goals.]

[Requires department to collaborate with health insurers and purchasers of health plans to develop strategies to reward publicly funded health plan enrollees for receiving care in line with patient centered primary care home program and to develop, test and evaluate community-based strategies that enhance specified services provided by patient centered primary care homes in underserved communities.1

[Appropriates moneys to department for Statewide Health Improvement Program.]

Authorizes Oregon Medical Insurance Pool Board to extend service provided by insurer under pool insurance program.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to health care; and declaring an emergency. $\mathbf{2}$

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding ORS 735.620, the Oregon Medical Insurance Pool Board is 4 authorized to extend the three-year period of service for no more than an additional 24 5 months, on terms mutually agreed upon with an insurer that is administering the insurance 6 program or components of the insurance program pursuant to ORS 735.620 on the effective 7 date of this 2009 Act. 8 SECTION 2. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 9

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 10 July 1, 2009. 11

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
