SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Expands eligibility for medical assistance for low income and uninsured women diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to medical assistance; amending ORS 414.534.

3 Whereas the incidence of breast cancer in Oregon is among the top five in the nation; and

4 Whereas 2,444 women were diagnosed with breast cancer and 134 women were diagnosed with

5 cervical cancer in Oregon in 2008; and

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6 Whereas low income and uninsured women often do not have access to screening for breast and

cervical cancers and therefore are more likely to wait to seek medical assistance until a cancer is
symptomatic; and

9 Whereas under the federal Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Act of 2000, 10 an eligible woman will have 72 percent of her medical costs covered by federal funds; and

11 Whereas a woman who has been diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer may receive "charity

12 care" from a provider, which drives up the cost of health care for all Oregonians; now, therefore,

13 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

14 **SECTION 1.** ORS 414.534 is amended to read:

414.534. (1) The Department of Human Services shall provide medical assistance to a womanwho:

[(a) Is screened for breast or cervical cancer through the Oregon Breast and Cervical Cancer
 Program operated by the department;]

19 [(b) As a result of a screening in accordance with paragraph (a) of this subsection,]

20 (a) Is found by a provider to be in need of treatment for breast or cervical cancer;

(b) Meets the eligibility criteria for the Oregon Breast and Cervical Cancer Program
 prescribed by rule by the department;

23 (c) Does not otherwise have creditable coverage, as defined in 42 U.S.C. 300gg(c); and

24 (d) Is 64 years of age or younger.

(2) The period of time a woman can receive medical assistance based on the eligibility criteria
 of subsection (1) of this section:

27 (a) Begins:

28 (A) On the date the department makes a formal determination that the woman is eligible for

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1 medical assistance in accordance with subsection (1) of this section; or

2 (B) Up to three months prior to the month in which the woman applied for medical assistance

- 5 (A) The woman is no longer in need of treatment; or
- 6 (B) The department determines the woman no longer meets the eligibility criteria of subsection
- 7 (1) of this section.
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
