Senate Joint Resolution 30

Sponsored by Senator MORSE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Expresses support for Oregon Progress Board in developing Oregon Shines III.

1	JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Whereas the Oregon of the future can provide unparalleled economic opportunities while main-
3	taining Oregon's traditional values if this state pursues its goals with clarity of purpose and perse-
4	verance; and
5	Whereas Oregon is in the midst of a massive economic, social and environmental transformation,
6	and in order to expand economic opportunities while maintaining Oregon's unique quality of life in
7	the face of this transformation, Oregonians must have a vision for their preferred future that spans
8	economic, social and environmental concerns; and
9	Whereas Oregon's competitiveness depends on its ability to improve and sustain its economic,
10	social and environmental well-being simultaneously; and
11	Whereas achieving this competitiveness requires a shared vision, shared data and collaboration
12	across policy areas and branches of government and across state, local, public and private sectors;
13	and
14	Whereas for two decades Oregon has had a statewide strategic plan called Oregon Shines; and
15	Whereas the Oregon Progress Board has reported the state's progress toward the plan's goals
16	biennially since the early 1990s using high-level outcome measures called the Oregon benchmarks;
17	and
18	Whereas 2009 marks the end of the 20-year time frame of the original statewide strategic plan,
19	and 12 years have passed since the last overhaul of that plan and the benchmarks; and
20	Whereas state and local governments, the business community, philanthropic and not-for-profit
21	organizations and the citizens of Oregon are all partners in advancing the statewide goals; and
22	Whereas the Governor and the Legislative Assembly play a critical role in statewide leadership
23	and in allocating Oregon's resources for suggested strategies; and
24	Whereas recovering from the current economic crisis demands a renewal of collaboration and
25	data-based strategic thinking for the next 20 years; and
26	Whereas it is anticipated that the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
27	House of Representatives will form a Commission on Oregon's Competitiveness to provide statewide
28	leadership and support to the Oregon Progress Board in articulating Oregon's next 20-year strategic
29	plan; now, therefore,
30	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
31	That we, the members of the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly, resolve to join with the Gov-
32	ernor to provide leadership to the state and support to the Oregon Progress Board in engaging local
