Impact Explanation: The estimates are based on the history of the program as well as projections for future use of the tax credit. In 2008, 21 corporation taxpayers claimed a total of \$7.1 million in affordable housing tax credits. Eighteen of these corporations were able to reduce their tax liability by a total of \$1.9 million, an average tax reduction of roughly \$106,000 per beneficiary.
