House Bill 3147

Sponsored by Representative CANNON (at the request of Joseph Warren)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits operation of motor vehicle with bumper clearance exceeding original manufactured bumper clearance by more than three inches. Punishes by maximum fine of \$360.

2	Relating to motor vehicle bumpers.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle
5	Code.
6	SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the offense of operation of a motor vehicle with im-
7	proper bumper clearance if the person:
8	(a) Drives or moves a motor vehicle registered in this state on any highway with a
9	bumper clearance that exceeds the original manufactured bumper clearance by more than
10	three inches; or
11	(b) Owns a motor vehicle registered in this state with a bumper clearance that exceeds
12	the original manufactured bumper clearance by more than three inches and causes or
13	knowingly permits the motor vehicle to be driven or moved on any highway.
14	(2) For purposes of subsection (1) of this section, bumper clearance shall be measured
15	from the surface of the roadway to the bottom edge of the bumper when the vehicle is at the
16	manufacturer's design load weight and the tires are inflated to the manufacturer's recom-
17	mended pressure for the specified loading condition.
18	(3) This section does not apply to the following vehicles:
19	(a) Commercial motor vehicles and commercial vehicles;
20	(b) Vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of more than 10,000 pounds; and
21	(c) Vehicles exempt from mudguard and fender requirements in ORS 815.190.
22	(4) The offense described in this section, operation of a motor vehicle with improper
23	bumper clearance, is a Class B traffic violation.
