Corrected Summary

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[For purposes of corporate excise taxation, allows increase in amount deducted as net operating loss carryforward to account for federal adjustments or modifications to taxable income that were dis-allowed, under Oregon law, in year of loss, less any further Oregon adjustment or modification.] Provides, for purposes of personal income taxation, that subtraction from federal taxable income is not allowed for amounts included in calculation of Oregon net operating loss.

Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, [2011] 2009.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

2	Relating to net operating losses; and prescribing an effective date.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2011 Act are added to and made a part of ORS
5	chapter 316.
6	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding ORS 316.739, a subtraction from federal taxable income is
7	not allowed for amounts included in the calculation of an Oregon net operating loss under
8	ORS 316.014.
9	SECTION 3. If a taxpayer has claimed a subtraction for a previous tax year that is dis-
10	allowed under section 2 of this 2011 Act, the taxpayer may comply with section 2 of this 2011
11	Act by filing an amended return or by adding to income on the taxpayer's return for the 2011
12	tax year the amount of the disallowed subtraction.
13	SECTION 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2011 Act apply to tax years beginning on or after
14	January 1, 2009.
15	SECTION 5. This 2011 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2011
16	regular session of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
