Senate Bill 630

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Limits ability of local government to disclose energy score information regarding building. Prohibits local government from requiring building owner or lessor to disclose energy score information for building. Creates exception.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the regulation of energy-related information for buildings.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **<u>SECTION 1.</u>** (1) As used in this section:

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5 (a) "Energy score" means energy requirements, energy efficiency, energy conservation

design, materials or features, comparative energy use or other information relating to the
amount of energy used by a building.

8 (b) "Local government" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.116.

9 (c) "State government" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.111.

(2) Except as provided in this section, a local government may not disclose information
 received by the local government regarding the energy score for a building. A local govern ment may disclose information regarding the energy score for a building:

13 (a) To the owner or lessor of the building;

(b) To a party identified by the owner or lessor of the building as being authorized to
 receive the information;

(c) To any party, if the disclosure of the information to that party is expressly authorized
 under state or federal law;

(d) To a local, state or federal government agency if the agency receiving the information
agrees not to disclose the information to the public in a manner that allows identification
of the disclosed information with a specific building, a group of related buildings or a group
of buildings that are of substantially identical design; or

(e) To any party, if the disclosed information is presented to the party in a manner that
 prevents identification of the disclosed information with a specific building, a group of related
 buildings or a group of buildings that are of substantially identical design.

(3) Except as provided in this section, a local government may not require an owner or lessor of a building to disclose information regarding the energy score for the building to a person other than the local government. This subsection does not prohibit a local government from requiring the owner of a commercial building to disclose information regarding the energy score to potential lessors of the building. This subsection does not apply to any disclosure required under a contract that the owner or lessor of a building enters into with the local government providing for improvements to the building that are funded by or

- 2 (4) Subsections (2) and (3) of this section do not apply to a building owned or leased in
- 3 whole or in part by state government or local government.
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
