SB 1503 A

Requires health care worker to provide health care facility for or at which health care worker provides services with evidence that worker received annual seasonal influenza vaccination or written declaration that worker declines vaccination.

SB 1504 A

Exempts insurer from requirement to send notice of cancellation of health benefit plan if cancellation is due to nonpayment of premium.

SB 1507 A

Removes requirement that person subjected to HIV test give specific informed consent to test.

SB 1565 A

Permits supervising physician or supervising physician organization to apply to Oregon Medical Board for dispensing authority for physician assistant.
