Testimony in Support of HB 4162, providing civil rights and sexual harrassment protections to interns Friday, February10, 2012, 3 p.m., Senate Health Care, Human Services, and Rural Policy Committee

Chairs Garrett and Kennemer, Vice-Chairs Doherty and Esquivel, Representatives Conger, Hoyle, Johnson, and Matthews:

The Oregon Commission for Women, in its role of advocate for the women of Oregon, strongly supports this bill. This bill extends civil rights and sexual harassment protections to a very vulnerable population—interns who are working to gain education and experience to better themselves and their employment prospects.

Current Oregon workplace law applies only to those who have a direct employment relationship with the employer and does not cover interns. In some cases, interns have not been able to seek redress for sexual harassment because they are not considered employees. This bill closes a glaring loophole in workplace protections.

As we have seen time and again, interns can be subjected to predatory behavior and are extremely vulnerable to sexual harassment. Under current law, they are not even able to bring a civil rights complaint against their employer. The Commission believes that it is in the best interests of Oregon women to have workplace protections for all who labor in a workplace, not just paid employees.

Please vote Aye on HB 4162.
