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Testimony of Peter Hainley on Amendment to HB 4038 House Energy, Environment and Water Committee Thursday, February 2, 2012

For 22 years, the **Farm Worker Housing Tax Credit** has been leveraging scarce reueral and private funds. The economic impact of the construction of the housing and the ongoing operation are significant in the rural communities where the housing has been constructed. It is an efficient way to raise funds and the finished product is an incredible resource to ensure a stable workforce in the rural areas.

The credit has helped alleviate some of the abysmal living situations for agricultural laborers in our fine state. While 1,500 new community-based units have been created and many on-farm units have been rehabilitated or newly constructed, it is estimated that only 3% of the state's agricultural workers are housed in safe, decent and affordable housing.

The **Oregon Farm Worker Housing Coalition** was formed after the tax credit was not extended during the 2011 legislative session. Despite multiple hearings in the House Agricultural and the Joint Tax Credit Committees, there was insufficient time to get the bill passed. Upon the suggestion of Senator Burdick, interested parties got together to discuss the issues that arose from the 2011 hearings. Oregon Opportunity Network, representing housing, economic development and social service organizations throughout the state, convened a number of meetings and helped form the coalition. Members of this coalition, including representatives from the **Oregon Farm Bureau**, **Oregon Association of Nurseries** and **Oregon Tree Fruit Growers** met over a period of seven months with the **Departments of Agriculture, Revenue, Housing and Community Services** and **OR-OSHA** to discuss ways to make the credit more efficient and accountable. The agencies have determined the actions that they will take and are on the verge of signing a memorandum of understanding which memorializes these actions.

We urge the committee to **extend the farmworker housing tax credit to 2020.** This housing is vital to the health and well-being of our rural, agricultural communities.
