here is growing evidence that key fish breeding grounds and nursery habitat must be reserved as safe havens. We we already protected 10 percent of our land areas in parks and national forests, in our ocean it's less than one percent that is protected world wide. Over-fishing is a problem in our oceans, and it's time to recognize it, and act. I think the analogy is apt, that Marine Reserves are like a savings bank that we can draw upon. Rather than eating into our principal, as we've done for the last thousand years, by setting up a network of fisheries reserves, we will in a sense put a portion of our ocean wealth into low-interest municipal bonds. This is an investment that if left alone will pay a steady, compound interest over time.
