Dear Co-Chair Gilliam, and Co-Chair Tomei, 2/6/12 Members of the committee;

My name is Ronda Hatefi, Eugene. I am the founder of Oregonians for Gambling Awareness Organization.

It is my pleasure and honor to be here today to support HB 4083. I have been working with the issue of problem gambling since 1995, the year my brother took his life after failed attempts to control his gambling.

It is my belief that the best way to give gamblers the message of help and hope is to educate them on what responsible gambling is, and how to get help when needed. I think the same is true for our State. We are hoping to help send the message that the Oregon Lottery is able to show responsibility in its mission, by changing its marketing strategies, and retail regulations.

Statistics show that the earlier people start to gamble the more likely they are to become a problem gambler. It also shows that when young adults gamble, they are more likely to take part in other risky behaviors. This is why it is so important to not target this age group when marketing the new products.

I understand the mission of the Oregon Lottery is to maximize revenues, but I also understand the social cost of problem gambling on our families in Oregon.

Is Someone You Know ...?

Preoccupied with gambling?

(reliving past gambling experiences; planning the next venture; or thinking of ways to get money with which to gamble.)

Secretive about his/her gambling habits and defensive when confronted? Increasing bet amounts when gambling in order to achieve the desired excitement ("high")

Trying unsuccessfully to control, cut back, or stop gambling Restless or irritable when not gambling

"Chasing" losses with more gambling

Lying to family and others about the extent of gamblin Committing crimes

Jeopardizing or losing relationships, jobs, education or career opportunities

<u>Relying on others</u> to bail him or her out of a financial situation caused by gambling
