Using the correct title for the state Director of Head Start Collaboration

Removes non-voting status from the original bill and makes all voting members.

Changes age range from zero to 5 to zero to six so no one falls through the cracks.

Clarifies that this includes tribal representation; tribal representation is also a part of the Youth Development Council membership and tribal best practices are included in sections referencing best practices and evidence base practices.

Gives ELC members expiration dates of 2014 and 2015; the bill had 2013 and 2015. Just made it one more year for better continuity.

As with the bill, language from the Head Start Ac is directly included in the bill, including one sentence that was left out and is now on page 7, line 30 onto page 8.

Kotek's process language throughout

Replaces global budget with comprehensive children's budget per the handout I shared earlier this week.

As in the bill, calls for an analysis of family resource manager functions.

Page 13, the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment process includes the input of Kindergarten teachers.

Initiates revisions, rather than implements, so that the process can be smooth and not cost money.

Page 13, section 17, 2015 instead of 2013 as a deadline. Doesn't mean it can't happen sooner, but allows for existing work without creating costs.

Page 14 aligns with federal re-competition for Head Start.

Page 17 specifies that funds to tribes currently cannot be reduced but the Council.

Page 46 childcare involvement and quality language

Page 55 may waive planning requirements

Address CASA issue

Adds tribes to list of potential community based coordinators

Page 93 – lines 22-27 orderly transition language requested by counties

Page 94 moves the implementation date out to 2014

Page 131 – gives JCPAC one year transition

Page 143 – smooth's out the transition to a TQRIS by initiating development subject to funds available rather than implementing immediately

Page 44, section 133 was requested by local commissions on children and families, who testified in support of the bill Wednesday.
