Testimony in Support of HB 4160, Maintaining critical funding for TANF Friday, February10, 2012, 3 p.m., House Human Services Committee

Co-Chairs Gilliam & Tomei, Co-Vice Chairs Frederick & Thompson, Rep. Greenlick, Rep. Harker, Rep. Parrish, and Rep. Weidner:

The Oregon Commission for Women seeks your passage of HB 4160 in the 2012 Legislative Session ensuring the continuation of critical funds to families seeking self-sufficiency.

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program was implemented under the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PWRORA) of 1996 (Public Law 104-193). As Oregon struggles to emerge from recession, increasing numbers of women enter the workforce annually and continued funding to Post-TANF empowers recipients in their transition to employment and economic stability.

The Oregon Commission for Women believes that while the factors that lead families to seek temporary assistance are complex, the road out of poverty is clearer for parents knowing their families have basic support. It allows women to focus on transitioning into successful long term employment in a more stable environment.

Oregon's unemployment rate still remains higher than the national average, at 9.1 percent and its hunger rate remains above national figures. It is currently estimated that 500,000 Oregonians experience hunger, many of them children. Research has shown that economic

instability factors into issues of domestic violence and substance abuse, and similarly increase the risks of child abuse and neglect.

Thank you for your positive consideration of Post-TANF support for women in transition to employment. Please vote aye on HB 4160.
