FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

Seventy-Sixth Oregon Legislative Assembly – 2012 Regular Session Legislative Fiscal Office

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Measure Description:

Provides legislative approval of Oregon Health Authority proposals for coordinated care organizations.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Department of Human Services (DHS), Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS),

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is solely for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Health Care, Human Services and Rural Health Policy to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

SB 1580 provides legislative approval to the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to implement the Oregon Integrated and Coordinated Care Delivery System (CCOs) created during the 2011 legislative session via HB 3650 (2011). This system integrates and replaces an existing system of managed care organizations, mental health organizations, and dental care organizations for Medicaid and Oregon Health Plan patients. The bill authorizes the Department of Consumer and Business Services and OHA to enter into agreements governing the disclosure of information. The bill requires OHA to report to an appropriate legislative committee on a quarterly basis.

The Oregon Health Authority and the Department of Human Services both anticipate having a fiscal impact associated with this bill. The amount of this impact is still being determined. A more complete fiscal analysis will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
