Extends the sunset date for the farmworker housing tax credit to January 1, 2020. Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to verify that the farmworker housing is in compliance with specified laws prior to issuing a letter of credit. Adds the farmworker housing tax credit to the transparency law.
