**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Modifies requirements for licensure by Board of Medical Imaging. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Provisions of the bill
- Allows provisional license-holders to continue to work until 2014
- Allows state-sponsored license-holders to continue to work after 2014
- Allows grandfathered radiographers to continue to work after 2014

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** In 2009, the Legislative Assembly enacted House Bill 2245. The measure made several changes:

- Changed the Board of Radiologic Technology to the Board of Medical Imaging;
- Expanded the definition of medical imaging to include new technologies;
- Modified the medical imaging licensing provisions; and
- Established deadlines for the new licensing requirements.

Upon implementation of these modifications, the Oregon Board of Medical Imaging (OBMI) has discovered several unintended consequences to the licensees as a result of the previous changes.

House Bill 4008 addresses those situations to allow all new and renewing medical imaging licensees to fulfill the updated requirements.
