WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires insurers to reimburse nurse practitioners at same rate as physicians for same services. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Nurse Practitioners (NPs) are nurses with specialized graduate-level study within the specific scopes of practice for which they are licensed. NPs practice independently and are increasingly becoming primary care providers for many people. Since 2009, insurers have been reducing reimbursement rates for NPs, beginning with psychiatric mental health NPs and moving into primary care NPs. The proponents assert that equitable reimbursement for NPs will improve access to Oregonians and will provide fair treatment to NPs that operate independent practices.
