SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries to inform Director of Veterans' Affairs of receipt of written information from or filing of complaint by member or veteran of uniformed service under certain circumstances.

Takes effect July 1, 2012.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to communication between state agencies regarding members of uniformed services; and prescribing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "uniformed service" means the Armed Forces of the United States, the Army National Guard or the Air National Guard when the member is engaged in active duty for training, inactive duty for training or full-time National Guard duty, the commissioned corps of the United States Public Health Service and any other category of persons designated by the President of the United States in time of war or national emergency.

- (2) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries shall notify the Director of Veterans' Affairs within 30 days of receipt of written information from, or the filing of a complaint for violation of ORS 659A.082 or 659A.086 by, a member or veteran of a uniformed service.
- (3) The commissioner shall notify the director as required by subsection (2) of this section only if authorized to do so by the member or veteran of a uniformed service who submitted the written information or filed the complaint.

SECTION 2. This 2012 Act takes effect on July 1, 2012.
