## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Extends certain rights and benefits to members of commissioned corps of National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.
