Public Hearing

- HB 2955 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Permits employee of contracting agency that conducts cost analysis or determines feasibility of procurement to seek judicial review of cost analysis or determination.
- HB 3035 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Requires school districts and community college districts to include certain information on Oregon transparency website.
- HB 3080 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to update information on Oregon transparency website at least once every six months.
- HB 3258 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Establishes office of State Chief Information Officer for purpose of directing policy and coordinating state government and state agencies in planning for, acquiring, installing and using telecommunications and information technology.
- HB 3328
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Removes Oregon Department of Administrative Services as exclusive authority for procuring or providing information technology, telephone and telecommunications services for state agencies.
- HB 3329 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Establishes State Data Center Board and prescribes board's duties.
- HB 3360 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
FIRST PUBLIC HEARING: Establishes Task Force on State Agency Information Technology Expertise for purpose of investigating extent to which creating division or other administrative unit within state agency and employing information technology specialists to meet common and critical information technology needs among state agencies is practical and feasible and to determine costs and benefits of employing information technology specialists within state agencies compared to costs and benefits of contracting for

- HB 2370 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires that additional information be posted on Oregon transparency website.

- HB 2381 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Allows state agency to establish voluntary contribution programs that allow persons to make voluntary contribution for projects identified by agency as worthy of funding, and of interest to public, but for which no or inadequate funding sources exist.
- HB 2931 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services and Capital Projects Advisory Board to use established definitions, criteria and methods to evaluate extent of deferred maintenance on state facilities.
