House Bill 2153: Charter Schools

Focusing charter school proposals based on district needs.

The first primary focus of HB 2153 is to allow districts that have reached a certain threshold of charter school capacity in their district to bring about greater focus to charter school applications and to provide greater relevance of charter schools to a school district's main educational goals.

- If, in any given year, a district has more than 3% of its students in local charter schools, that district may amend its application process to consider only proposals that specifically address one or more stated educational goals, as defined by the district.
- The district may specify the number of students it seeks to serve through charter schools to meet this goal.
- Any district goal that a charter applicant seeks to address must be an element of the charter application, and progress toward advancement of this goal will also be a factor considered in future charter renewals if the charter application is approved.
- Any district implementing this alternate application process must do so on an annual basis, following calculation of the percentage of district students in district charter schools.
- While this alternate application process may only be implemented in the case where a district has more than 3% of its students in charter schools, it is not mandatory for a district to implement it, even if the district meets the 3% criterion.

Renewal of state-sponsored charter schools by local districts.

The second main focus of HB 2153 is to create a process and opportunity for state-sponsored charter schools to seek and gain approval for renewal from their local, resident school district.

- After a state-sponsored charter school has been in operation for at least one year, it
 may submit a request to the local school district board for a change of sponsorship from
 the State Board of Education to the local school board.
- At least one year prior to the expiration of their contract, however, the charter school is required to submit to the local school board for renewal.
- The local school board shall treat the request as though the charter is being renewed, and will follow statutory processes concerning renewal.
- The local board's decision to accept or deny the request for change of sponsorship is final and not subject to appeal. If the local school district board denies the request, the charter school may seek renewal of its charter with the State Board of Education.
