I urge you to vote no on HB 2748 for the following reasons:

1) HB 2748 has a negative financial impact on school funding. This is a time when every dollar counts for education. Private tuition paid to public schools is an important funding source. Most tuition paying families will likely move their children to private schools, and this money will be lost to the public system.

2) Not only does tuition paid to public schools help support the school to which it is paid, but it also helps the home district because, more money and space is available to schools in the home district of the "private" student.

3) HB 2748 removes our right to choose the most appropriate educational situation for our children. I am sure that you will agree that freedom of choice is a fundamental principal of life in America.
