Representative Komp, Senator Monroe and Members of the Committee:

The City of Springfield and the University of Oregon have a very positive and mutually beneficial relationship. UO students live and shop in Springfield and serve as a source for our workforce. The UO is an important presence in our community and we support and encourage increased funding for higher education.

In 2011, Springfield was the partner city for the University of Oregon's Sustainable Cities Year. The Sustainable City Year is a partnership between the University's Sustainable Cities Initiative program and one city in Oregon each academic year. During the course of the partnership, university faculty and students focused on assisting the city, as well as other TEAM Springfield partners, with sustainability goals and projects. The partnership involved more than 400 students and approximately 20 faculty members from a range of academic disciplines. It was awe inspiring to see the UO students and faculty descend on Springfield with the goal of improving the lives of its citizens.
