
Medicaid Title XIX Program Matching Fund

(Approximately 50% match required, programs vary in specific requirements.)

- Programs are Administered by the Administration on Aging.
- Funds are distributed to each state by formula.
- Some programs are administered nationally with funds going to a contractor or Area Agency on Aging (AAA) without distribution to a state.



Type A AAA's Provide Services for People 60+ years. Type A's Coordinate Services for Seniors & Adults with Disabilities with the Department of Human Services.








Oregon Project Independence (Type A & Type B Area Agency on Aging)
