The Lake County Board of Commissioners extends to you our support of House Bill 2941. A portion of HB 2941 would require public utilities to purchase twenty megawatts of solar power from the Oregon National Guard.

As you might be aware, this Board has been in support of utilizing the Christmas Valley Backscatter Radar site for the production of solar energy. We understand that passing of this Bill will give no guarantee that this type of solar site would be located in Lake County. However, we believe this would be a positive step forward for opening the doors for solar production at the Backscatter site.

Lake County has worked steadily to remain on the forefront of renewable energy exploration in order to offset the loss of timber funding and to promote and attract businesses to our County. We continue to move forward with economic development strategies for building of our resources for solar energy production as well as biomass, geothermal, and wind. House Bill 2941 would benefit these strategies significantly.

Dear Honorable Bailey:

I am writing to encourage you to vote for House Bill 2941 to require public utilities to purchase 20 MW of solar power from the Oregon National Guard.

Lake County Commissioner Brad Winters and I were co-conveners of the Oregon Solutions to utilize the Backscatter Radar site near Christmas Valley for production of solar energy. While there has been controversy for solar sites in the Christmas Valley there are no known objections to utilizing the Backscatter site.

Lake County is 78% government owned land and 22% of the land has to support the government programs desired by the public. Potentially having a 20MW solar farm built at the Backscatter site could generate around \$100,000.00 in new taxes for the State and local taxing districts. Lake County is very remote and attracting business here is very difficult. The one thing we do have is power line capacity and ample sun. Part of Lake County's economic development strategy is to attract biomass, geothermal, solar, wind and small hydro companies to build power production facilities. This strategy will create over 200 permanent jobs and in excess of \$5 million in new tax revenue.
