Chair Roblan and members of the Committee, I am Leah Perkins-Hagele, President, Oregon Fairs Association and Manager of the Washington County Fair Complex in Hillsboro. I am pleased to offer support for Senate Bill 7 -2 Amendment.

The Oregon Fairs Association is the statewide organization made up of Oregon's 36 county fairs, the Oregon State Fair and 150 businesses that provide goods and services to the fair industry. OFA supports SB 7 and the -2 amendments.
