That came in my co-founding a survivor led brain injury support, referral, and resource organization called BIRRDsong. Providing support & resources and prevention of getting this life changing injury was my passion and I was determined to do whatever it took to do just that. I was blessed with a team of people who were willing to put their 'feet on the street' joining me in this pursuit. I and this fabulous ever growing team of support continue to work tirelessly however sadly our jobs will never end. There will always people sustain TBI in accidents, falls, fights or in my case in a car crash by a person making a very bad choice. That choice, to drink and drive.

I'm writing this letter to you today to ask your help. Senate Bill 721 needs the focus and attention of the Oregon legislature and needs to be passed in order to prevent our young athletes, our future, from the horrific aftermath of a TBI. ALL coaches and / or persons in charge of these athletes in any and all sports need to be able to spot concussion, pull the player until proper evaluation is done saving him or her from a future anything less than healthy.
