Chair Hass and members of the committee:

For the record, my name is Mary Cadez and I'm the Assistant Superintendent Salem-Keizer Public Schools and I'm here today to support SB 271.

After working diligently for the past 6 years on improving our professional development efforts in Salem- Keizer District, we know these factors are critical to our success:

Professional development that improves teaching and learning must be:

- 1. The result of purposeful planning aligned to our district's strategic plan and identified needs (meaningful and utilitarian value)
- 2. Accessible, modeled and dynamic (able to be altered or changed based on feedback from our staff) and available to our staff on demand.
- 3. Delivered by instructional coaches and administrators who are trained together in order to ensure consistency, use of common language and feedback that ensures fidelity to the program model or strategy.
- 4. Embedded into classroom practice and practiced in the classroom with feedback so that implementation is not left to chance.
- 5. Supported by coaches and mentors.
- 6. Planned so that teachers have time to observe each other in practice and time to debrief in order to gain new skills or refine their practice.
- 7. Differentiated, teachers must be recognized as learners and need to have their adult learning needs met. Mid-career teacher's needs may be much different than a beginning teacher's needs.
- 8. Networked and shared with like schools and/ or districts to increase the return on our investment and expand our skills and knowledge.
- 9. Oriented to the future in order to develop internal professional capacity to meet the demands the district may face.

Teachers develop over the continuum of their career. It is not a one shot deal!

We know that most of the smaller districts throughout the state do not have the capacity that Salem-Keizer has to deliver great, job-embedded coaching on their own. But if we can bring together those people and resources through a statewide network and we can ensure that network is aligned with state standards, we can better serve more students and teachers. Please pass SB 271.
