SB 491

1. The state of Oregon does not have the authority to relieve parents of their responsibilities to care for and be involved in decisions affecting their children.

2. The parent has the right to know any third party's evaluation and recommended treatment.

3. There must be a method whereby a parent's requests or disagreement are considered.

4. By holding the care provider harmless; how does that foster accountability? I did not see whether any treatment requires second or third party concurrence.
