I am writing on behalf of the Westside Economic Alliance (WEA), a non-profit, member-based organization that advocates for a healthy economic environment on the Westside of the Portland, Oregon metropolitan region. The **WEA opposes House Bill 3316** because it creates a politically appointed board that does not fairly represent the metro region.

Washington County is home to many employers including the burgeoning tech and clean energy industries. With a rapidly growing private sector employment base, **Washington County businesses pay a significant portion of the payroll taxes that fund TriMet's operations.** Our members have recognized that TriMet's board understands the valuable link between public transportation and employment.

The Westside Economic Alliance is very concerned that **HB 3316 will decrease and marginalize the westside's representation on TriMet's Board of Directors.** We recognize that TriMet, like many public agencies, is experiencing difficulties. However, diminishing the voices of the businesses that pay for TriMet's operations while simultaneously polarizing the board will not resolve these problems.

And while we are encouraged by the steps TriMet is taking to address out of control health care costs, assistance from the region and political leaders such as yourself is critical if TriMet is to begin restoring service sooner rather than later.
