Please do NOT support HB2387 which removes the statue of Jason Lee, an Oregon Founder which stands in Statuary Hall in the U.S. Capitol building replacing it with a statue of Governor Mark Hatfield.

John McLaughlin and Jason Lee were both FOUNDING FATHERS of the State of Oregon.

Mark Hatfield, was a Republican career politician of 30 years in US Senator for Oregon and also was Governor of Oregon. An Oregon Statesman is <u>not</u> an Oregon National Treasure, his memorial should remain within Oregon.

HB2387 declares an emergency.
