PDX USO Projected Timeline

Pre Lease Phase (~3 months)

April 1 thru July 1 – USO Board approval, fund raising, lease development and review process

July 1 - Lease signed with USO and notice given for relocating tenants *Completion of this phase could move faster or slower based on fund raising milestones as well as lease development, review and processing.

Post Lease, Pre Construction Phase (~2 months)

July 1 thru July 15 - 50% building drawings developed July 15 – 50% drawings turned into the Port of Portland July 29 – Port comments back July 29 thru Aug 14 – 100% building drawings produced Aug 14 – 100% drawings turned into the Port of Portland Aug 28 – Port comments back Aug 28 thru Sep 5 – Permit issued Sep 5 – Pre construction meeting

Construction Phase (~1 to 2 months)

Sep 5 thru mid/late Oct - Construction

Operational Start-Up (~1 month)

Mid/late October – Soft opening November 11 (Veterans Day) – Grand opening

Total time projected time frame is approximately 7 months.

Colonel (Retired) Joseph M. Williams



Colonel Williams' final assignment prior to his retirement on 30 September 2007 was as the Operations Officer for the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff, G4 (Logistics) for Mobilization and Training Headquarters, Department of the Army, The Pentagon.



Prior to Colonel Williams arriving at the Pentagon in August 2005, he was a National Security Fellow at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government in Cambridge, MA from August 2004 to July 2005.

Colonel Williams' military career began by enlisting as a Cavalry Scout in his hometown Army National Guard unit in Junction City, KS. Upon completing Officer Candidate School, he remained in the Kansas ARNG where he served in the 1st Battalion, 635th Armor, 69th Infantry Brigade as a Tank Platoon Leader, Tactical Intelligence Officer, and Assistant Operations Officer in Abilene & Manhattan, KS.

In 1982, Colonel Williams transferred to the United States Army Reserve and from September 1982 to March 1985, he was assigned to the 2nd Squadron, 322nd Cavalry initially as the S1 and later as Commander of Troop E at Fort Riley, KS. From July 1985 until October 1987, he commanded the 342nd Transportation Detachment in Manhattan, KS before transferring to the 821st Transportation Battalion in Topeka where he served from October 1987 to January 1990 as the S1, later the S2/3 and finally the Battalion Executive Officer.

From January to August 1990, he served on active duty in both Honduras and Fort Sam Houston, TX working for Fifth U.S. Army as an Administrative Officer. In September 1990, he entered active duty in the USAR Active Guard/Reserve (AGR) program and was assigned to the 1394th Deployment Control Unit (DCU) as a Movement Team Chief at various locations in the Continental United States and the Kuwaiti Theater of Operations until July 1991 during Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm. From July 1991 to May 1994 he served as the S4, 1394th DCU at Camp Pendleton, CA.

Colonel Williams was reassigned to Fort Sam Houston, TX as the Logistics Readiness Officer from 1994 to 1996 for the 90th Army Reserve Command. From 1996-1997, he was Deputy Commander, 363rd Corps Support Group in San Marcos, TX. He was then reassigned to Heidelberg Germany as the USAR Logistics Advisor at HQ, U.S. Army Europe from 1997 to 2000 when he was re-assigned to the 311th Corps Support Command (COSCOM) at Fort Lewis, WA. From August 2000 until May 2002, he was the 311th COSCOM Liaison Officer to I Corps. In April 2002, he was promoted to Colonel and commanded Logistics Task Force Wright from May 2002 until June 2003 before serving as the 311th COSCOM Deputy Commander (Forward) at Fort Lewis until his reassignment to Harvard University in July 2004.

Colonel Williams is a graduate of Officer Candidate School; the Armor Officer Basic and Transportation Officer Advanced Courses; Command & General Staff College; Naval War College Joint Maritime Operations and Strategy & Policy Courses, and was an Army War College Fellow at Harvard University. He holds a BS in Management /Finance from Park College and an MA in Computer Resources and Information Management from Webster University.

His military awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit; Meritorious Service Medal w/4 Oak Leaf Clusters (OLC); Joint Service Commendation Medal; Army Commendation Medal w/7 OLC; Army Achievement Medal w/OLC; National Defense Service Medal; Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal; Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal; Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal; Southwest Asia Service Medal; Armed Forces Service Medal and the Armed Forces Reserve Medal.

His civilian career highlights include Owner/Broker CENTURY 21 Williams Real Estate, 1981-1988, Owner/Instructor Kansas Real Estate Academy, 1981-1989, and Shelter Insurance Agency Manager, 1979-1985. He has two sons, Chase & Bradley, and lives in Tigard, Oregon.
