HB 2919 Summary Regarding Marijuana in Oregon

What is HB 2919?

- 1. Allows for Fit-to-purpose technology oversight, tracking & legal framework
- 2. Allows for professional scientific and research persons to participate professionally as full-time resources, researchers and educators.
- 3. Allows for internal solutions to state and federal enforcement objectives.
- 4. Allows direct physician and medical community engagement.
- 5. Allows for agriculture, medical, chemical, genetic, operational and financial data for marijuana related decision making
- 6. Utilizes the State's medical-use & 10th Amendment authorities to allow a professional medical-use based marijuana program
- 7. Engages marijuana as a beneficial technology.
- 8. Allows a professional program to generate research funding.
- 9. Alleviates marijuana efficacy burden upon physicians
- A. Establishes a Professional Assessment & Oversight Board of experts
- B. Allows practicing medical doctors in Oregon to voluntarily possess and distribute small amounts of marijuana, like pharmaceutical samples.
- C. Requires industry transparency to include financials, inventory, custody & annual reporting Requirements
- D. Allows outdoor, greenhouse, and indoor farm sites to voluntarily register with the pilot program based on competency & participation with a transparency requirement.
- E. Allows research sites to voluntarily register with the pilot program based on competency & participation with a transparency requirement.
- F. Creates a professional service permit registration of roles based on individual's legal History and demonstrated competency with regard to role performed & participation with the Transparency Requirement.
- G. Creates a distributor permit based on a legal history and demonstrated competency with regard to role performed & participation with the transparency requirement.
- H. Creates an inspector permit based on a legal history and demonstrated competency with regard to role performed & participation with the transparency requirement.
- I. Creates an affirmative defense for legal participants.
- J. Limits sites to appropriate zoning.
- K. Limits sites to 18 for 5 years, and then removes site number-only restriction.

What is HB 2919 not?

- i. It is not a Research Project itself; it allows professional-grade researchers to contribute and guide Oregon's Marijuana Program.
- ii. It's not legalization
- iii. It's not driven by marijuana advocacy
- iv. It's not a program; it's legal framework.
- v. It's not funded by the State
- vi. It does not treat marijuana as a tolerated illegal commodity.


HB 2919: Program Visual Overview




