SUMMARY

Requires person to opt out of voter registration on Department of Transportation application forms for issuance or renewal of driver license, driver permit, state identification card or change of address if person does not wish to register to vote.

Directs voter registration agencies to use forms that allow applicants for services to register to vote and apply for services or assistance using same form. Requires person to opt out of voter registration on form if person does not wish to register to vote.

Directs county clerk to send postcard notice to electors who register at Department of Transportation office or voter registration agency using form. Allows elector to update registration by returning postcard to county clerk.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to voter registration; creating new provisions; amending ORS

3 247.012, 247.017 and 247.208; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 247.017 is amended to read:

6 247.017. (1) The Department of Transportation shall make a voter regis-7 tration card available to any person at any office of the department where 8 licenses or renewal applications are distributed or received.

9 (2)(a) When a person who is at least 17 years of age applies for issuance 10 or renewal of an Oregon driver license[,] as defined in ORS 801.245, an 11 **Oregon driver permit as defined in ORS 801.250** or issuance of a state 12 identification card under ORS 807.400, or submits a change of address ap-13 plication form at a department office where driver license or driver permit 14 issuance or renewal applications, state identification card applications or change of address applications are distributed or received, department personnel shall inform the person that the person may register to vote at the
department office.

(b) Department personnel shall ask the [applicant] person whether the
[applicant] person is registered to vote at the [applicant's] person's current
address and, if not, whether the [applicant] person would like to register to
vote at the department office.

8 (c) Department personnel shall also inform the person that the 9 person must opt out of the voter registration portion of the application 10 form described in subsection (5) of this section if the person does not 11 wish to use the form as an application for voter registration.

(3) If a person who is at least 17 years of age provides the information required by ORS 247.171, other than party affiliation, on an application form described in subsection (5) of this section and does not opt out of using the voter registration portion of the form as an application for voter registration, the department shall consider the voter registration portion of the form a completed voter registration card.

[(3)] (4) Each office shall deliver in a timely manner the completed voter 19 registration cards to the county clerk or elections officer of the county in 2021which the office is located. The county clerk or elections officer of the county where the office is located shall forward the registration card to the 22county clerk or elections officer of the county in which the applicant resides. 23The county clerk or elections officer may reject any registration card in ac-24cordance with ORS 247.174. The Secretary of State shall determine by rule 25the time and manner the completed registration cards are to be delivered to 26the appropriate county clerk or elections officer. 27

[(4)] (5) The department shall develop a driver license and driver permit issuance or renewal and voter registration application [procedure and] form, a state identification card issuance and voter registration application [procedure] form and a change of address and voter registration application

1 [procedure] form that allows an applicant for a license, permit, renewal, state identification card or change of address to register to vote by providing $\mathbf{2}$ the information required by ORS 247.171, other than political party affil-3 iation, and the information required for the issuance or renewal of a license 4 or permit or for issuance of a state identification card. A form developed 5under this subsection must contain a space for a person to indicate 6 that the person opts out of using the voter registration portion of the 7 form as an application for voter registration. The Secretary of State 8 shall approve the voter registration portion of each [application procedure 9 and change of address procedure] form. 10

[(5)] (6) The voter registration portion of an application form described in subsection [(4)] (5) of this section shall comply with provisions of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31).

14 [(6)] (7) The Secretary of State shall adopt rules establishing procedures 15 for meeting the requirements of subsection [(3)] (4) of this section.

[(7)] (8) Information relating to the failure of [an applicant] a person under this section to sign the voter registration portion of an application form for issuance or renewal of a driver license, driver permit, issuance of a state identification card or [for] a change of address may not be used for other than voter registration purposes.

21 **SECTION 2.** ORS 247.208 is amended to read:

247.208. (1) The Secretary of State by rule, in accordance with the re-22quirements of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31), shall 23designate agencies as voter registration agencies. Agencies designated may 24include state, county, city or district offices and federal and nongovern-25mental offices with the agreement of the federal or nongovernmental offices. 26(2) Services required by the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 27103-31) and this section shall be made available in connection with any 28registration card at each voter registration agency designated by the Secre-29tary of State. 30

31 (3) A person providing services referred to in subsection (2) of this section

1 at a voter registration agency [shall] **may** not:

2 (a) Seek to influence the political preference or party registration of a
3 person registering to vote;

4 (b) In accordance with provisions of the Oregon Constitution, display

19 [(a) Distribute a registration card, including all statements required under 20 the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31); and]

[(b) Provide a form including other information required by the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31).]

(4) Each voter registration agency designated under this section
shall make a voter registration card available to any person at any
office of the agency where agency services are provided.

(5)(a) When a person who is at least 17 years of age applies for
 services or assistance from a voter registration agency, agency per sonnel shall inform the person that the person may register to vote
 at the agency office.

30 (b) Agency personnel shall ask the person whether the person is 31 registered to vote at the person's current address and, if not, whether

(c) Agency personnel shall also inform the person that the person
must opt out of the voter registration portion of the application form
described in subsection (8) of this section if the person does not wish
to use the form as an application for voter registration.

6 (6) If a person who is at least 17 years of age provides the infor-7 mation required by ORS 247.171, other than party affiliation, on an 8 application form described in subsection (8) of this section and does 9 not opt out of using the voter registration portion of the form as an 10 application for voter registration, the agency shall consider the voter 11 registration portion of the form a completed voter registration card.

12 (7) Each agency office shall deliver in a timely manner the completed voter registration cards to the county clerk or elections officer 13 of the county in which the office is located. The county clerk or 14 elections officer of the county where the office is located shall forward 15the registration card to the county clerk or elections officer of the 16 county in which the applicant resides. The county clerk or elections 17officer may reject any registration card in accordance with ORS 18 247.174. The Secretary of State shall determine by rule the time and 19 manner the completed registration cards are to be delivered to the 2021appropriate county clerk or elections officer.

(8) Each voter registration agency shall develop a form that allows 22an applicant for services or assistance from the agency to register to 23vote by providing the information required by ORS 247.171, other than 24political party affiliation, and the information required for the appli-25cation for services or assistance. A form developed under this sub-26section must contain a space for a person to indicate that the person 27opts out of using the voter registration portion of the form as an ap-28plication for voter registration. The Secretary of State shall approve 29 the voter registration portion of the form. 30

[(6)] (11) A completed registration card accepted at a voter registration
agency designated under this section shall be delivered to a county clerk or
the Secretary of State.

(a) Assess new and developing federal guidelines regarding compliance
with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31);

(b) Identify steps necessary to ensure ongoing compliance with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (P.L. 103-31);

(c) Identify barriers to and research opportunities for ensuring the accu racy, security and efficiency of current voter registration processes at voter

(a) Delivering by mail or otherwise a completed registration card to any
county clerk, the Secretary of State, any office of the Department of Transportation or any designated voter registration agency as described in ORS
247.208;

(b) Personally delivering the card to an official designated by a countyclerk under subsection (7) of this section;

8 (2) If a registration card is mailed or delivered to:

9 (a) Any person other than a county clerk or the Secretary of State, the 10 person shall forward the card to a county clerk or the Secretary of State not 11 later than the fifth day after receiving the card; or

(b) The Secretary of State or a county clerk for a county other than the county in which the person applying for registration resides, the Secretary of State or county clerk shall forward the card to the county clerk for the county in which the person resides not later than the fifth day after receiving the card.

17 (3) Registration of a qualified person occurs:

(a) When a legible, accurate and complete registration card is received in
the office of any county clerk, the Office of the Secretary of State, an office
of the Department of Transportation, a designated voter registration agency
under ORS 247.208 or at a location designated by a county clerk under subsection (7) of this section;

(b) On the date a registration card is postmarked if the card is received after the 21st day immediately preceding an election but is postmarked not later than the 21st day immediately preceding the election and is addressed to an office of any county clerk, the Office of the Secretary of State, an office of the Department of Transportation or any designated voter registration agency as described in ORS 247.208; or

(c) In the case of a registration card missing a date of birth, containing an incomplete date of birth or containing an unintentional scrivener's error that is supplied or corrected as described in subsection (4) or (6) of this

section, on the date that registration would have occurred if the registration
 card had not been missing the date of birth, contained an incomplete date
 of birth or contained the scrivener's error.

4 (4) Except as provided in ORS 247.125, if a registration card is legible, 5 accurate and contains, at a minimum, the registrant's name, residence ad-6 dress, date of birth and signature, the county clerk shall register the person. 7 If this information is missing from the registration card or the date of birth 8 is incomplete, the county clerk shall attempt to contact the person to obtain 9 the missing or incomplete information. The county clerk may supply the 10 registrant's date of birth from any previous registration of the registrant.

(5) If a registration card meets the requirements of subsection (4) of this section but is missing an indication of political party affiliation, the registrant shall be considered not affiliated with any political party. This subsection does not apply if an elector is updating a registration.

15 (6) If a registration card contains an unintentional scrivener's error, the 16 county clerk may attempt to contact the person to correct the error.

(7) A county clerk may appoint officials to accept registration of persons
at designated locations. The appointments and locations shall be in writing
and filed in the office of the county clerk. The county clerk shall be responsible for the performance of duties by those appointed.

(8) A registration card received and accepted under this section shall beconsidered an active registration.

23 (9) A registration may be updated at any time.

24 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Section 5 of this 2013 Act is added to and made a part 25 of ORS chapter 247.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) Upon receiving a completed voter registration card under ORS 247.017 or 247.208, the county clerk shall send by nonforwardable mail to each elector a postcard stating:

(a) That the elector has been registered as not affiliated with any
 political party;

31 (b) That the elector must update the elector's registration to choose

a political party if the elector wishes to vote in the primary election
 of a major political party;

3 (c) The Internet website address of the Secretary of State's elec4 tronic voter registration system; and

5 (d) That the elector may choose a political party listed on the 6 postcard and return the postcard to the county clerk in order to up-7 date the elector's registration.

8 (2) If the county clerk receives a postcard described in this section
9 that contains an elector's choice of a political party, the county clerk
10 shall update the elector's registration.

11 <u>SECTION 6.</u> (1) Section 5 of this 2013 Act and the amendments to 12 ORS 247.012, 247.017 and 247.208 by sections 1 to 3 of this 2013 Act be-13 come operative on January 1, 2014.

(2) The Secretary of State, a county clerk, the Department of 14 Transportation and any voter registration agency may take any action 1516 necessary before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section to enable the secretary, county clerk, department or agency 17to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) 18 of this section, all the duties, functions and powers conferred on the 19 secretary, county clerk, department or agency by section 5 of this 2013 20Act and the amendments to ORS 247.012, 247.017 and 247.208 by sections 211 to 3 of this 2013 Act. 22

23 <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate pres-24 ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is de-25 clared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.
