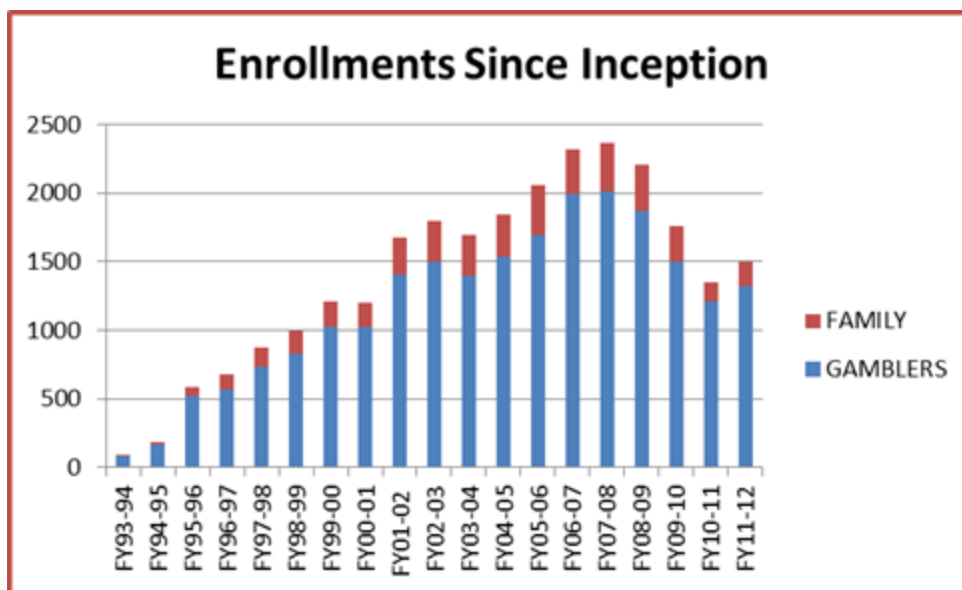
To the Members of the Joint Ways and Means Transportation and Economic Development Subcommittee:

On Wednesday, February 13, the Subcommittee held an informational meeting to review the state lottery. Larry Niswender, Director of the Oregon State Lottery, has submitted the following information in response to questions he was asked at that meeting.

Question: I was asked about the number of people who avail themselves of problem gambling treatment.

Question: I was also asked whether there was any urban and rural difference in those numbers.

Response from OHA - Based on the first six months of the current FY there is statistically no difference between rural (47%) and urban (52%) penetration base on our expected 3% of the adult population.
