- Provides information regarding how to balance summative assessments with other types of assessment
- Developed by ODE in collaboration with school districts, ESDs, Legislators, Stand for Children, and the OEA
- Provides general decision-making guidance for teachers and administrators regarding the most appropriate time to test students on the state test (OAKS)

HB 2664

- Directs ODE to conduct an evaluation of the use of standardized tests in public schools
- Fiscal, administrative, and educational impacts of standardized tests
 - Instructional and administrative time, curriculum, professional flexibility, technology, budgets
- Report due July 1, 2014
- Questions
 - What's the definition of a "standardized test?" Does in include district imposed testing?
 - Would this report be inclusive of all districts or a sampling of districts?
- This report will require a significant amount of data to be submitted by districts (new data collection)

HB 2862 (similar to HB 2664)

- Directs ODE to conduct a study to determine the effectiveness of statewide assessments.
- Identify grades in which assessments should be administered
- Identify costs associated with administering statewide tests, including direct costs for materials, scoring, and staff time
- Report due October 1, 2014

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
