Honorable Members in the leadership offices of the Idaho and Utah State Legislatures:

Like both Idaho and Utah, Oregon has important roadways dedicated to all veterans: Idaho has individual Medal of Honor Freeways; Utah's Interstate 15 is its Veterans Memorial Highway; and in Oregon, Interstate 205 is our War Veterans Memorial Freeway.

In addition to this, Oregon is currently contemplating the dedication of a portion of Interstate Highway 84 within her borders, to honor veterans of the Vietnam War specifically. (Reference Senate Bill 461.)

The Senate Veterans and Emergency Preparedness Committee recently heard testimony from veterans of the Vietnam War, describing perhaps its most distinguishing feature: the general lack of civilian support at home for an unpopular campaign, that was unfairly extended and personalized against individual service members.

The dedication of a roadway specifically to honor Vietnam veterans, symbolizes the long road they have traveled, to finally be welcomed home.

We respectfully invite our peers and our neighbors in Idaho and Utah – who share Interstate 84 – to consider designating it the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway, in order to achieve an unbroken length of roadway specifically dedicated to veterans of the Vietnam War.
