Whereas Brigadier General Julie A. Bentz received a Reserve Officers'

3 Training Corps commission from Oregon State University in June 1986 and

4 was assigned to active duty as a Nuclear Medical Science Officer, 10th

5 Medical Laboratory, in Landstuhl, Germany; and

Whereas in 1999, General Bentz transferred to the Oregon Army National

Guard to assist in the initial stand-up of the 102nd Civil Support Team; and

8 Whereas General Bentz was selected as the executive officer of the 102nd

9 Civil Support Team from June 2003 to February 2004 before accepting the

10 position of Director of Response Operations for the Homeland Security

Whereas in addition to a bachelor's degree in radiological health from

Oregon State University, General Bentz holds a master's and a doctorate

14 degree in nuclear engineering from the University of Missouri and a master's

15 degree in national security strategy from the National War College at the

16 National Defense University; and

18 citations, including the Legion of Merit, which is the sixth medal in order

19 of precedence and is one of only two United States military decorations worn

20 around the neck, the other being the Medal of Honor; and

1 Whereas General Bentz has more than 24 years of service and has held multiple roles, from field work to White House advisor, and has been dis-2 tinguished as a leader wherever she is assigned; and 3 Whereas on June 24, 2011, General Bentz was promoted to the rank of 4 Brigadier General and assigned as the Director of Strategic Capabilities 5 Policy on the National Security Council in Washington, D.C.; and 6 7 Whereas General Bentz is the first female officer in the history of the Oregon Army National Guard to achieve the rank of Brigadier General; now, 8 therefore, 9 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon: 10 That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, com-11 12 mend and honor Brigadier General Julie A.
