(1) The State Department of Energy shall reviewstudy 18 the following issues related to the Energy Facility Siting Council, and 19 make recommendations to the 2014 Legislative Assembly concerning any 20 proposed legislative improvements to the process for siting energy 21 facilities including: 22 (a) Means of encouraging consistency of siting standards between 23 federal, state and local governments, including tiering of jurisdictional 24 thresholds so that local governments may be authorized to review larger 25 facilities when their standards are consistent with state 26 standardsEnhanced collaboration and coordination by state agencies 27 pursuant to ORS 469.350 on matters related to applications for site 28 certificates. 29 (b) Means of encouraging public participation early in the design and 30 location of energy facilities. 31 (c) Clarifying the definition of a single energy facility for purposes of 32 jurisdictional thresholds. The types of energy facilities required to obtain a 33 site certificate from the Energy Facility Siting Council pursuant to ORS 34 35 469.300 to 469.563. (ed) Means of assuring constructive and effective participation in 36 siting decisions by other state agencies and local governments. Enhanced 37 38 efficiencies in the process of siting energy facilities pursuant to ORS 469.300 to 469.563. 39

(2) The department shall submit a report with the results of the
 study, and including and recommendations for legislation, to the interim
 committees of the Legislative Assembly related

to environment and natural resources on or before November 1, 2013.
 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on January 2,
 2015.

SECTION 3. This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
