It is my understanding that this bill would proscribe any local regulation of agriculture in Oregon. I believe that such a law would negatively impact the economy, the health, the livability and the future environmental conditions of our state. I strongly urge you to oppose any such legislation, which would place serious roadblocks in our collective progress toward a sustainable culture.
