- 2. How much of the state's aggregate supply is under Class I and Class II soils?
- 3. What is the high-quality sand and gravel aggregate under Class I and Class II soils used for?
- 4. Of the current uses of high-quality aggregate, could aggregate from quarries be used instead?
- 5. How does aggregate mining affect cumulative non-farm impacts on agriculture?
- 6. If a small percentage of high-quality soils are being affected, why is this a concern to the agriculture industry?
- 7. How would the alternatives analysis work?
