Re: HB 2477 - Earned Income Tax Credit - SUPPORT

The League of Women Voters of Oregon is a non-partisan, grass roots political organization that encourages informed citizen participation in government. We support HB 2477 which extends the critical tax credit for Oregon's working poor.

The League supports programs and policies to prevent or reduce poverty and to promote selfsufficiency for individuals and families, including quality of health care, income assistance, housing and public transportation access. Given the status of Oregonians in poverty, an estimated 660,000, and that one in four children are hungry, continuing the Earned Income Tax Credit fits the criteria for extension and should be a no-brainer.

The League also supports an increase in the tax credit from 6 percent to 8 percent as reflected in the Governor's proposed budget for 2013-15. HB 2850 makes a 9 percent extension and builds in the incremental increases to the tax credit over succeeding biennia to 18 percent. While we feel that is an excellent goal and should be seriously considered, we want to ensure that the current tax credit is extended now.

The League strongly urges the committee to recommend extending the Earned Income Tax Credit to the Joint Tax Credit Committee.
