## EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** On August 9, 2012, the Clackamas County Board of Commissioners proclaimed the communities of Boring, Oregon and Dull, Scotland a "Pair for the Ages." House Bill 2352 designates August 9 of each year as Boring and Dull Day.

The two communities were brought together after a Scottish vacationer took a bike ride through Boring, Oregon and contacted friends living in Dull, Scotland. The residents of Dull then worked with the Boring Community Planning Organization to arrange for a connection between the two places. Neither Boring nor Dull are incorporated cities, so they do not qualify for the official Sister City program. They have, however, become partners in an unofficial capacity, bringing both Boring and Dull international media attention and increased tourism. HB 2352 seeks to further the relationship by establishing Boring and Dull Day in Oregon.
