REVENUE: No revenue impact

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires persons convicted of crimes requiring sex offender registration in a court of the United States to register in Oregon, regardless of whether that crime is a sex crime in Oregon. Applies to both federal and state convictions. Applies only to crimes committed after the passage of this act.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

• Sex offenders should not escape the registration requirements of other states

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Clarifies that measure applies to federal registration as well. Clarifies that the requirements do not apply retroactively to crimes committed before the date of enactment.

BACKGROUND: House Bill 3253-A insures that Oregon does not inadvertently incentivize sex offenders moving into this jurisdiction in order to avoid the sex registration requirements that they were sentenced under in a different jurisdiction.
