WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires Oregon Transparency Website to include each state agency's percentages of expenditures made inside and outside of state under all contracts for goods or services entered into each biennium.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Discretionary contracting preference for Oregon goods and services enacted in 2011
- Ability to track efficacy of local preference in state contracting
- Posting information to Oregon Transparency Website instead of including in Governor's budget report

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces the original measure.

BACKGROUND: The 2011 Legislative Assembly enacted House Bill 3000, which authorized contracting agencies to provide certain preferences for Oregon goods and services. That measure built on the foundation of House Bill 2763 (2009), which allowed contracting agencies to pay up to 10 percent above the lowest bid for agricultural products produced and transported entirely within Oregon, and allowed an even higher percentage if the contracting agency makes a written determination of good cause.

House Bill 3400 A requires the publication of state agencies' percentages of in-state and out-of-state contract expenditures on the Oregon Transparency Website.
