WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Adds two members to Oregon Education Investment Board (OEIB). In making new appointments to OEIB, Governor is required to consult with and appoint member of oldest nonprofit network of parents in Oregon that provides statewide representation of parents and consult with organization representing school district boards to select one member of school district board. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Eligibility for appointment by parent involved with parent network other than Parent Teacher Association
- Ability of parents to join Parent Teacher Association
- Content of amendment

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Requires Governor to consult with and appoint member of oldest nonprofit network of parents in Oregon that provides statewide representation of parents to Oregon Education Investment Board.

BACKGROUND: The Oregon Education Investment Board (OEIB) was created in 2011 with the enactment of Senate Bill 909. The OEIB is chaired by Governor John Kitzhaber and is composed of twelve board members who are community and education leaders and the Superintendent of Springfield Public Schools, who serves as alternate chair. The OEIB's goal is that by the year 2025, 100 percent of Oregonians will earn a high school diploma or its equivalent, 40 percent will earn a post-secondary credential, and 40 percent will obtain a bachelor's degree or higher. The work of the OEIB builds on the efforts of the Oregon Education Investment Team, created by the Governor in February 2011.

House Bill 2640-B adds two new members to the OEIB, whom would be selected by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate. In making the two additional appointments, the Governor would be required to consult with the Oregon Parent Teacher Association (PTA), the largest network of parents in Oregon, to select one member who is a parent of a student in a public school in any grade, kindergarten through grade12, and the organization representing school district boards to select one member of a school district board.
