Measure Description:

Approves certain new or increased fees adopted by State Board of Pharmacy.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Summary of Expenditure Impact:

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

SB 1565 passed during the prior legislative session allows for the dispensing of prescription drugs by a physician assistant under the supervision of a physician or supervising physician organization. The measure required the supervising physician or organization to register and be licensed by the Board of Pharmacy as a dispensing drug outlet.

During the interim following the 2012 Legislative Session, the Board of Pharmacy adopted rules and set a fee of \$300 after seeking approval from the Department of Administrative Services. The Board of Pharmacy anticipates that the revenue generated by the fee will total roughly \$12,000 in the 2013-2015 biennium.
