## **REVENUE:** No revenue impact FISCAL: Fiscal statement issued

**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Includes within the compelling prostitution statute, ORS 167.017, attempts to compel prostitution when force or intimidation is used or the victim is under eighteen.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Trafficked children compelled into prostitution are victims.
- The punishment for those who compel children into prostitution should be harsher than it currently is.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Removes the provision pertaining to promoting prostitution.

**BACKGROUND:** Currently a person commits the crime of compelling prostitution if the person knowingly: (1) uses force or intimidation to compel another to engage in prostitution; (2) Induces or causes a person under the age of 18 to engage in prostitution; or (3) Induces or causes a spouse, child or stepchild to engage in prostitution. Compelling prostitution is a Class B felony.
